The Clinical Competency Committee (CCC) for the Residency Program at University/Hospital meets twice a year to review resident evaluations, progress and standing. As part of a resident's formative evaluation, the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) requires the program to "use multiple evaluators (e.g., faculty, peers, patients, self, and other professional staff)" - from Common Program Requirements, V.A.2.b).(2).
There are six "core competencies" that the ACGME follows for each resident, tracking them as <a href="Milestones">Milestones</a> of progress towards independent practice. Those six core competencies are: Patient Care, Medical Knowledge, Interpersonal and Communication Skills, Professionalism, Practice-Based Learning and Improvement, and Systems-Based Practice. Stanford offers a concise description of <a href="Core Competencies">Core Competencies</a> with examples for each, as a guide.
If you feel comfortable providing me with a multidisciplinary evaluation speaking to any of the above competencies, it would be very useful in the CCC's review of my performance. An email sent to the program coordinator, at (email address) , would be highly appreciated.
